

WWPN Alley Clean-Up Saturday, September 24th, 8:00 am.

Come prepared Saturday September 24 (just a week before Fort 4 Fitness) at 8:00 am to help us travel through the alley ways and toss debris and trash into the garbage truck. Take a look at the attached map to see our intended route. Please note, that the truck drivers are very skilled, but it is VERY difficult to turn a large garbage truck around our tiny alley ways. So, to help out, if you usually park a vehicle on the street, please plan NOT to park too close to any of the alley intersections where the truck may need to turn.

Here a few more details:

- Meet at the corner of Hoagland and Taber at 8 am on Saturday, September 24th to pitch in and clean up our alleyways.
 - Be prepared – bring work gloves, shovels/rakes/ pitchforks/smiling faces / great attitudes.
 - If you have items that you'd like collected, take time before the event to bag trash, cut up debris, and make it obvious that you would like it disposed of.

- If you live in between on one of the "H" alleyways, please try to move any items you'd like collected to the closest "T" intersection of the "H".
- Leaves and hazardous materials such as batteries, liquid chemicals, auto motive parts, electronics, etc. are not intended to be placed in the trash and will not be picked up.


