Holiday Home Tour Recap

Neighborhood consensus is that it was a good event. Not much feedback from social media. The committee would like to make it a hybrid of in person/virtual tour next year. We had a little over \$3600 in sponsorships and so far a total of \$853.61 in profits. Still need to pay out one more invoice. Since the theme was giving back to the community, Marlene F. motioned to donate all final profits to Community Harvest Food Bank instead of just 10%. Dick S. seconded. After a discussion about other charities more local to the 07 and our neighborhood and about making the donation process an event with the media, the motion passed unanimously.

HIP/SIP Recap

HIP = 9 total grants disbursed. \$2,191 out of \$3,000 given away. Total neighbor investment was \$26,225.

SIP = 6 total grants disbursed. \$1,156 out of \$2,000 given away. Total neighbor investment was \$3,981.

Programs will continue in 2021. The forms will be updated and passed out closer to the spring. There was a question and discussion about landlords using grant money. Consensus was that there was no need for a motion to change the current language on the application. Tony B. will be able to apply for his rental properties in the neighborhood.
