Restaurant Review: Three Rivers Distilling Co.

Rog and I recently visited this distillery/restaurant and were very pleasantly surprised. As we don't drink, we were there to check out the food. We were expecting "pub" food but were we ever wrong. The menu is not huge but the selections we tried were very good. Not being very hungry, we both opted for the half/half combo which was soup, a delicious homemade chicken rice with almost as much chicken as rice, and the freshest ever salads. Since we wanted to try a dessert, we shared the bourbon salted caramel cheesecake. Bourbon/cheesecake fans will LOVE this. The Fall Menu Preview was also available and very tempting. There were 5 items on this list: Smoked Pork Chop w/ potatoes, Pork Osso Bucco, Pot Roast w/ garlic Mashed Potatoes, Philly Cheesesteak Bahn Mi and Chicken Risotto w/bacon, pecans and corn. They all sounded yummy and we will go back soon to try some of them. The building and the indoor/outdoor seating are very nicely done. You are welcome to tour the distillery while there.


